Business Credit Principles

When: 1/5/21 - 3/9/21 meets weekly on Tuesdays Time: 3:00 – 6:00 p.m. PT Instructor: Rod Wheeland, CCE

Description:

This comprehensive course covers all of the vital elements of business credit, including the role of credit in financial management, the components of effective credit department systems, specific government regulations that pertain to business credit, credit policy and procedures, selling terms, negotiable instruments, the Uniform Commercial Code, credit investigations, finance and business insurance, business credit fraud, factors associated with credit limits, and international trade, as well as bankruptcy codes and alternatives to bankruptcy.

Financial Statement Analysis I

When: 4/6/21 - 6/8/21 meets weekly on Tuesdays Time: 3:00 – 6:00 p.m. PT Instructor: Rod Wheeland, CCE

Description:

This introductory class provides the student with an overview of basic financial statements, quality issues in using these reports, and analysis of these statements for the purpose of making trade credit decisions. Upon successful completion of this course, the student will understand basic financial statements, the audit letter and footnotes, various techniques used in statement analysis, including common-sizing, ratios addressing liquidity, operational performance, and leverage, and cash flow analysis, and the use of these techniques in credit decisioning

Business Law for the Trade Creditor

Description:

With the legal environment of business constantly changing, individuals working in credit and accounts receivable must have a solid understanding of the laws that affect business and credit and periodically update their knowledge.

This course is designed to introduce students to the basics of law, the legalities of contracts and the emerging importance placed upon laws affecting cybercrimes.

Credit Law for the Trade Creditor

When: 9/14/21 - 11/16/21 meets weekly on Tuesdays Time: 3:00 – 6:00 p.m. PT Instructor: Rod Wheeland, CCE

Description:

This course provides a review of the fundamentals of the American legal system and various aspects of Federal and State laws and regulations as they affect the trade creditor. Upon successful completion of this course, the student will understand the legal environment of business, legal forms of business organization, the Federal antitrust laws, the Consumer Credit Protection Act, agent responsibilities and liabilities, payment methods and processing, negotiable instruments, security interests in personal and real property, other forms of risk mitigation, insolvency and the Bankruptcy Code, and the use of these legal rights and responsibilities to maximize sales and minimize delinquency and bad debts.

Basic Financial Accounting

Description:

This course presents an introduction to basic financial accounting. Students begin at square one, learning the foundation of accounting principles. As the language of business, accounting is essential to business professionals.
