Program: What You Need to Know about Recent Changes to the Bankruptcy Code and Their Impact on Your Business as a Supplier

Description:

Several amendments to the Bankruptcy Code have occurred over the past several years, including some very recent changes, that alter the bankruptcy process and impact all constituencies, including suppliers. One significant change involves the addition of an entire new subchapter to the Bankruptcy Code that provides a new, more streamlined process for small business debtors to reorganize. While this new subchapter has some provisions that are beneficial to both debtors and creditors, some creditor-friendly provisions that exist in a normal chapter 11 case are stripped away. Another key amendment to the Bankruptcy Code alters preference lawsuits, something that suppliers frequently face. Please join Jason and John for a timely discussion of these and other important updates to the Bankruptcy Code and their impact on suppliers.

Jason M. Torf is a bankruptcy and creditors' rights partner in the law firm Ice Miller LLP. 


